MAIN JOB PURPOSE

As a member of the UK ISAR capability your role will also ensure UK ISAR are fully prepared to respond to international incidents as outlined in the MOU UK Fire and Rescue Sector Support to Her Majesty's Government for Emergency Response Operations Overseas.

The UK ISAR Training Officer will be responsible for planning, delivering, coordinating, and evaluating training activities required to support the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia Search And Rescue Team (SASART) in preparation for their INSARAG External Reclassification (IER) in November 2027.

The role provides technical, operational, and instructional leadership across all expected capability areas, with a particular focus on:

- Rope Rescue
- Shoring Systems
- Lifting and Moving Operations
- K9 Search and Technical Search (including ASR2)
- ExCon development and IER planning
- Assurance and competency verification
- SOP and Safety Protocol development

The post-holder will ensure the training programme aligns with INSARAG methodology and supports SASART's progress toward achieving international reclassification standards.

KEY AREAS OF RESPONSIBILITY

Training Delivery & Programme Management

- Lead the delivery of a two-year structured training programme consisting of seven week-long (Sunday–Thursday) visits.
- Deliver specialist training modules including rope rescue, shoring, lifting and moving, and technical search.
- Provide mentoring and operational coaching to sector leads, safety officers, and team command staff.
- Support the development and enhancement of organisational Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and safety protocols.

Technical Expertise and Guidance

- Offer specialist advice in technical rescue disciplines, K9 search, and ASR2 methodology.
- Promote safe working practices, ensuring alignment with international best practice.
- Provide input into equipment standards, PPE requirements, and operational procedures.

Performance Assurance & Competency Development

- Conduct assurance visits and evaluate progress against agreed annual training objectives.
- Identify capability gaps and design bespoke training interventions to address them.
- Prepare teams for the operational, management, and technical aspects of the IER.
- Conduct practical assessments, scenario-based evaluations, and structured feedback sessions.

Exercise Control & IER Preparation

- Provide expert support to the Exercise Control (ExCon) team, including planning injects, visual timelines, evaluation points, and observer management processes.
- Assist in the preparation of documentation, evidence portfolios, and readiness materials required for IER.
- Mentor SASART leaders on the expectations, flow, and format of INSARAG classification events.

Reporting and Documentation

- Produce written reports following each training visit, capturing strengths, gaps, and recommendations.
- Maintain accurate training records and competency documentation for SASART personnel.
- Contribute to UK ISAR internal reporting requirements and national capability development.
